Incident: Man Arrested- Promoting of Child Pornography

Location: Kitty Hawk Drive located in Columbia

Case Number: 2016-4028

Details:

On Thursday, October 6, 2016, a Boone County man was arrested for Promoting of Child pornography 1st degree, child is under 14 years old.

The investigation began in late July 2016 when the Boone County Sheriff's Department Cyber Crimes Task Force received a CyberTip report from the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. The CyberTip reported a subject in Columbia Missouri had uploaded child pornography using a chat room.

A Cyber Crimes investigator was able to identify the account holder was living at 1711 Kitty Hawk Apt 4 in Columbia when the child pornography was distributed through Skype chat.

On October 6, 2016, the Boone County Sheriff's Department Cyber Crimes Task Force served a search warrant at Singleton's residence. Investigators seized several pieces of electronic evidence to be analyzed by a forensic examiner from the Task Force.

The suspect is identified as 33 year old, Adam Singleton who resides at 1711 Kitty Hawk , Apartment 4 located in Columbia, Missouri. Bond is to be set.

All suspects are considered innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

The Boone County Sheriff's Department Cyber Crimes Task Force is comprised of investigators from the Boone County Sheriff's Department, the University of Missouri Police Department, the Federal Bureau of Investigations and the Boone County Prosecuting Attorney's office.
